



Biggest Barrier To Your Success...

- Persistence
- Recognizing the "value" of incremental "one degree shifts"

Too Specialized To Be Taught Superficially

- Gradual, bite-sized chunks of information
- Get some of the info from a number of perspectives
- Provide enough basic information so that each NGO UN Office Director can focus on educating volunteers and staff about their specifics

Too Specialized To Be Taught Superficially

- Needs to be step by step
- Many elements that stack on one another
- Whole sequence has a logic behind it
- Homework takes you one step closer to being "professional" in their PR and advocacy

More, Better, And Easier To Follow

- Launch of a learning system that is able to provide so much more than a one-day or even one-week intensive
- Helpful for other NGOs in the future





The Components

- Video Tutorials—one per day (on average) with a total of 10 per module. One module is released every 2 weeks.
- Worksheets, Info Sheets & Resource Area with the relevant tutorials
- Q&A calls (monthly) to answer your questions related to the content



The Components

- Interviews with others with experience at the UN or in relevant areas of experience.
- Mystery Bonuses— Things that come up that I don't even have a plan for now!



- Believe that you can
- Schedule time each day— Plan to become an "expert" on effecting change at the UN
- **Get involved** become a vital member of this community. Build a network!



- Go The Distance—To learn and internalize the material so that it becomes yours, listen to and review the material more than once. Focus.
- Reflect— Watch yourself to monitor your own learning, perspectives, attitudes and barriers.
 Explore why, when you meet resistance.



- Think Differently—Challenge yourself to think differently.
- Become Action Oriented—Anything work doing well is work doing poorly at first. To get good at anything and to really learn the material, you must actually apply it.



- Be Curious—Research and find out more. Develop your expertise.
- Teach It To Learn It—Teach what you learn to your own family or your colleagues. At least one person, each piece you learn.



Video Tutorials... Group Calls

- Ist Time—Give it your complete attention.
- Consolidate your notes— Into a single page.
- Review—the video or call. Exchange notes.
 Review weekly.
- Commit to Action—Schedule some action.



- Action Orientation—Do something. Do anything. Do it as part of your NGO's team, but go ahead and ACT!




What My Goal Is For You
